SAPRO's efforts to influence retailers begin to bear fruit

Implementing "Design for Recycling" principles helps to support local economy, boosts employment and improves quality of recyclate.



SAPRO's efforts to engage with retailers and to educate them about the importance of Design for Recycling is starting to bear visible fruit. One such an example is SPAR, who has recently made the decision to change the caps for their housebrand milk bottles from red, blue and green to white.

Furthermore, we continue to engage with Woolworths on their new PET carrier bag which has replaced the 100% recyclable plastic bag. In is SAPRO's view that the current PET bag does not lend itself to local recycling stream, in addition to the fact that it is not manufactured locally and therefore does not contribute to local job creation or support the notion of Proudly South African or 'local is better..."

We will continue to engage with the country's leading retailers as part of our mandate to build and support the local plastic recycling industry. We are hugely encouraged by the SPAR Group's willingness to take our recommendations and suggestions onboard. To this end we will continue with our discussion with Woolworths and are confident that ultimately they too will come to realise the benefits that can be derived from improving the quality of the recyclate.

SAPRO QUESTIONS RECYCLABILITY OF SURLYN

Polyco, the Polyolefin Responsibility Organisation NPC, has recently released its "Design 4 Recycle Guide".

Whilst we truly appreciate the effort that has gone into developing this document, SAPRO does have some reservations about declaring Surlyn as a recyclable material.

Whilst we understand that Surlyn can be reprocessed and be converted into planks used largely for garden furniture, floor decks products etc., it is also a fact that same materials cannot yield quality recyclate that could be used for products that it was originally intended.

SAPRO will continue to engage with all relevant stakeholders to ensure that the correct decisions are taken during the design stage of product packaging.

(Surlyn film is used primarily in skin packaging applications, which means the film forms around the product and onto a carded substrate such as cardboard or paperboard during the packaging process).



SA GEARS UP FOR CLEAN-UP & RECYCLE SA WEEK

13 - 18 SEPTEMBER 2021



Plastics SA is calling on South Africans to participate in the annual Clean-Up & Recycle SA week from 13-18 September 2021. Highlights of this year's week will be the inaugural River Clean-Up Day on Wednesday, 15 September, National Recycling Day on Friday, 17 September 2021 and the International Coastal Clean-Up Day/Let's Do It World Clean-up Day on Saturday, 18 September 2021.

Apart from raising awareness and supporting cleanup initiatives by donating refuse bags, gloves and other equipment needed, this will also be the 25th year that Plastics SA will be coordinating South Africa's participation in the International Coastal Clean-Up Day – the world's biggest volunteer effort for ocean health.

"Clean-Up & Recycle SA Week has become a highlight on our country's environmental calendar. This annual public awareness week is supported by all the packaging streams in South Africa and encourages citizens, corporates and municipalities to help remove all visible litter from our country's neighbourhoods and streets, rivers, streams, beaches and oceans," explains Douw Steyn, Plastics SA's Sustainability Director.

Plastics SA is hoping that this year will see a repeat of the huge success of last year's Clean-Up & Recycle SA Week. Despite the fact that COVID-19 restrictions prohibited the large groups at public clean-ups and gatherings that have become synonymous with this public awareness and volunteer effort, the spirit of camaraderie, positivity and willingness to make a difference in our environment, definitely made this one of the most memorable years.

"Like last year, we are one again advocating that South Africans be eco-warriors in their own neighbourhoods by picking up any litter on our beaches or strewn in streets, rivers, streams or canals. Where community clean-ups are planned, we urge the organisers to adhere to safety protocols by limiting the numbers of volunteers participating, ensuring that participants wear their masks, checking that they maintain social distancing and that enough sanitizing stations are in place," Steyn said.

Entries close on Thursday, 16 September 2021 at 1pm.

About the awards:

The event is a cornerstone of SAPRO's strategy to grow the demand for plastic recyclate and helps to improve market acceptance of locally manufactured recycled plastic products. By acknowledging and showcasing the remarkable and inspiring range of manufactured goods that can be made from recycled materials, SAPRO encourages brand owners, retailers, converters and industrial designers to consider recycled plastics as a material of choice.

Who can enter?

Everyone can enter including retailers, convertors, recyclers and brand owners. We look forward receiving your entries to demonstrate your Innovation and renovation capabilities and talents.

When and how will the winners be announced?

Owing to the COVID-19 pandemic this year's awards ceremony will be a virtual event that takes place on Thursday, 14 October 2021. During the event the recycler of the material the manufacturer of the product as well as the brand owner will be acknowledged. Each category will have a winner and the overall winner will be awarded.

Judging criteria:

Entries will be judged on a number of criteria, such as the life expectancy and sustainability of product, measures that were taken to ensure product consistency and customer satisfaction despite recycled material content, tonnages (or potential tonnages) of plastic waste that were converted and diverted from landfill, as well as the technical achievements in manufacturing to overcome recycled material challenges.

It is important for us to recognise and reward recyclers for creating new end-markets for recyclate that not only will continue to be in demand five years from now, but that also exhibit a "wow factor" resulting in people to start thinking differently about recycled materials.



Entries are now open for the 2021 SAPRO Best Recycled Plastic Products Award. This competition aims to acknowledge products that are made from recycled materials, thereby encouraging brand owners, retailers, converters and industrial designers to consider recycled plastics as a material of choice.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Entries are judged on a number of criteria, for example:

- Life expectancy of product
- Sustainability of product, i.e. long-term demand and market acceptance of product (will it still sell in 5 years' time?)
- Measures taken to ensure product consistency and, customer satisfaction despite recycled material content
- Tonnage (potential tonnages) converted
- Technical achievements in manufacturing to overcome recycled material challenges
- · Replacement of alternative materials
- Wow Factor!

(Various weightings could be used to judge products objectively)

HOW TO ENTER:

- 1.An entry fee of R2 000.00 (VAT included) must be paid online via Quicket for entries to be considered. Please note that failure to pay will automatically disqualify the entry.
- 2.Email the completed entry form to Phil Sereme on email address: GM@plasticrecyclingsa.co.za and nadia@plasticrecyclingsa.co.za.
- 3. Each entry must be accompanied by two professional quality digital images of high resolution (1+ MB) on a clearly marked CD or memory stick; one image of the product and one image illustrating the product application. Provide us with a motivation as why this product should win – max 300 words, on a separate page/document.
- 4.The actual, physical product must be delivered to the Plastics|SA Offices, 18 Gazelle Ave, Corporate Park, Midrand, marked for the attention of Phil Sereme (SAPRO), along with a hard copy of the entry form, photographs, and motivation on the closing date. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 5.It is the responsibility of the sender to confirm that the entry was delivered in person on telephone (067) 310-6999.
- 6.Should entrants require the return of their entries after the competition, arrangements must be made to collect the entry from the Plastics SA offices in Midrand, by no later than 21 October 2021.
- 7.This year's awards ceremony will be a virtual event on Thursday, 14 October 2021. During the event, the recycler of the material, the manufacturer of the product as well as the brand owner will be acknowledged. Each category will have a category winner and the overall winner will be awarded.
- 8. Any company in Africa may enter, provided that the recycled material originated in South Africa.
- Products submitted in prior years, that have not previously won an award, may be entered again.
- 10. No entries will be accepted after 13H00 on Thursday, 16 September 2021.

Product packaging and items used in the agricultural sector, e.g. irrigation pipes, crop protection, animal feed troughs etc.

4. Household & leisure products

Products such as plastic knives, forks and plastic bowls, domestic-ware, broom handles, garden chairs etc.

5. Automotive, electronic, technical and engineering

Products such as electric plugs and automobile bumpers, dash boards and mirror housings, machines switches etc.

6. Construction & building sector

Products ranging from roof sheeting, building bricks & paving to plumbing applications.
